The Rise and Rise of Riverside Pickleball

As a former competitive tennis player, I was introduced to pickleball with a spoonful of cynicism. Before I'd seen it, I knew the stereotypes: the simplicity of the game, its image of drawing older players, the ease of the learning curve, the grating sound of the ball, etc. While the tennis purists may endlessly refuse to bend the knee – so to speak – to the epic growth and ubiquity that is pickleball, their preconceptions are entirely to their detriment. I'm fortunate to have remained open-minded.

Recently, I sat down with West 104th Street resident Daniel Jenkins, a well-regarded Broadway actor and a key figure in the creation and evolution of Riverside Pickleball (RSP PB) - located on 110th St and lower Riverside Park. How did your interest in PB start?

DJ: A little after the pandemic, I was in Central Park and met a lovely octogenarian wielding a foreign-looking paddle. I asked about it and she introduced me to pickleball. I fell in love and started playing a few times per week.

How did that lead to your involvement at RSP PB?

the park with my son one day to find space down there on the concrete. We met an amazing woman named Margaret Bracken who happened to be scouting out what was then tagged as a "Derelict Use Area" between the skate park and the basketball

courts. She was able to secure funding from the Mayor's Office to fix up that space, and, given the growing popularity of pickleball, decided that should be the exclusive use of the area. From there I was quick to get involved.

What is special about RSP PB?

DJ: It's an unbelievable community that has sprouted up. The 5 regulation courts were recently resurfaced, and they look beautiful. We have paddles, balls, social events, tournaments,

and clinics for newcomers. We get players of all skill levels. The culture is friendly and welcoming. Everything is entirely free. We just want people to come out and have a great time. In my 40 years on the Upper West Side, I have never seen anything build community this fast.

It sounds idyllic. Are there any issues?

DJ: Sure. We get complaints from time to time about the queue and the process, and people come in flaunting their own rules...



We know we can't make everyone happy, but the unofficial steering committee is always listening to the players and adjusting. There are no leaders. There are just volunteers.

If I want to play down there, what are my options?

DJ: You can always just show up. Even first timers. Bring your own equipment. We have a comprehensive system for getting everyone on court who wants to play. If you wish to be on the pulse about upcoming events, clinics, etc., you can download Team Reach App and find us there.

Is there anything else to note?

DJ: While everything is free, we do accept donations (Venmo @rsp110). And—this is important not only for us but everyone who visits Riverside Park—we have a petition going around to renovate the bathrooms on 108th St. It would be great to get that word out as well. https://actionnetwork.org/petitions/restroom-renewal-in-riverside-parkat-108th-street

In Memorium: Phyllis Sperling 1944-2024



The block and neighborhood have lost a treasured friend. Phyllis Sperling died September 1, 2024 from liver cancer. She and her husband Herman Sands moved to 315 Riverside Drive as they were wrapping up their careers as architects and professors at Architecture at City Tech (CUNY). Sperling served for some years as Dean of the School of Technology and Design there.

Sperling joined the Block Association board in 2008 and served on it until 2014. During that time, she and her husband also were co-founders of Bloomingdale Aging in Place (BAiP). She acted as board chair and president in 2015. This thriving neighborhood charity aims to connect and support seniors so they can continue to live in the community. Sperling devoted much energy and effort to seeing the organization prosper and expand. Today it serves 1565 active members living between West 96th Street and West 110th Street between Riverside Drive and Central Park West.

Sperling established the BAiP Herman Sands Annual Award in her husband's honor after his death in 2013. With Candy Dato, she was BAiP activities co-chair, creating many ways for BAiP members to learn, grow and celebrate together. She will be sorely missed.
